We are very fortunate to have established a partnership with the Bowls for Hope lunch program. Hearty and nutritious soup, buns and milk is delivered to the school each day. The program ensures healthy lunches for students that may not have a lunch or on "those" days when a lunch has been forgotten at home. It is not intended to replace lunches when students "don't like" their lunch. If students don't have a lunch, they ask the supervisor for a soup pass, they eat their soup in the pod and return to class just prior to the playtime bell. We have established the program as an open-door program to avoid any stigma. However, attendance is taken so in the event that a student is a frequent attender, parents will be notified to ensure the parent is aware.

Please remember that Unsworth is a "Nut Aware" school. We have many students who have serious, life-threatening nut allergies. Reaction to contact (touch, ingestion, even smell) with nuts or nut products can send these students into anaphylactic shock. Students (with their parents' support and guidance) have done an awesome job of watching what they bring for lunch and snacks. Please remember that due to the sticky nature of peanut butter, it is especially dangerous for students with nut allergies as it can remain on surfaces (tables, chairs, taps...) long after students have left the eating area. Please help us keep all of our students safe by not sending peanut butter or tree nut products to school. Thank you for your assistance in maintaining a safe school for all of our students.

October - Child health screenings: vision, hearing and dental

Make dental, hearing and vision checks part of a healthy routine

Health screenings help find issues early which can make treatment easier and more effective. It's important for your child to have regular eye exams and routine dental checkups. It is also important to recognize any hearing loss early as this is essential for speech and language development. Read on to learn when and how to access services for your child.

Dental

Tooth decay is the most common, but preventable, childhood chronic disease. It is important to establish good oral hygiene at a young age and have children's teeth checked by a dentist regularly. To find a local dentist near you who is accepting new patients, visit the BC Dental Association's <u>Find a Dentist database</u>. If you are a member of a low-income family and you do not have extended health coverage, there are several programs that can help you access <u>affordable dentistry for your children</u>. You can also contact the dental program at your <u>local public health unit</u> and ask about resources available in your community.

Vision

BC Doctors of Optometry recommends children receive their first eye exam when they are six to nine months old with a follow up exam at least once between the ages of two and five and then yearly once they enter school. You can find an optometrist accepting new patients near you at the College of Optometrists of British Columbia's Find an Optometrist database. In B.C., basic eye exams, one per year, are free up to the age of 18. Some optometrists may charge a small user fee of about \$35 per visit so be sure to ask about any fees before you make an appointment.

Hearing

Good hearing is essential for speech and language development and plays an important part in a child's social and emotional growth. It is important to recognize hearing loss early and seek out testing and treatment if needed. Fraser Health's Public Health community audiologists provide hearing services for children from birth to 19 years of age. If you have a concern about your child's hearing, referrals can be made by a parent or caregiver, a health care provider or education professional to your <u>local public health audiology (hearing) clinic</u>.

Parking Lot Reminders

A reminder that the parking lot and student safety is a school community responsibility.

Please be mindful of the following:

- The curb-side lane is the DROP OFF LANE ONLY and is meant to allow for continuous flow and movement. Please pick up and drop off in the drop off zone only, which is the curved part of the lane in front of the flagpoles. Students waiting to be picked up need to wait in front of the flagpoles which allows for the vehicle to pull up, the child to quickly load and the vehicle then pulls forward and merges into the thru lane.
- Please do not park or wait anywhere along the curb side lane, particularly at the end of the drop off lane. Curb side parking blocks the flow and purpose of the drop off lane and causes a back-up of vehicles and frustration for drivers, thus causing unsafe conditions for our students.
- Please note that if our Primary parents pick up AT the bell, and parents of our Intermediate students pick up roughly 5 minutes AFTER the bell, it will really help keep the flow of traffic moving on Unsworth Road and in our Parking lot. Thank you everyone for your help with this!

If your child is not waiting and able to immediately get into the vehicle, please loop around the parking lot and re-enter the drop off lane until you are able to pick up or find a parking stall to park or wait.

Please remind children to use the crosswalk both in the school parking lot and to cross Unsworth Road.
