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Message from the Principal

Welcome to February (and a Leap Year) at Unsworth 😊

This month students will be focusing on demonstrating acts of <u>Kindness</u> throughout the month, showing what kindness looks like to them, purchasing Candy Grams to help provide a random act of kindness for others in our school. We are also recognizing and celebrating <u>Black History Month</u> at Unsworth. Every morning, our Morning Announcement crew will be highlighting the achievements & contributions of influential leaders that helped make Canada and the rest of our world a better place.

On February 29th from 4:00 - 6:00 pm our classes are hosting parent/teacher/student conferences. Each classroom teacher will send home information specific to their conference format and schedule. This is an opportunity for you to connect with your child's teacher to discuss the progress made this year and goals for the rest of the term or year. All parents can support success in school by reading with your child(ren) every night. While reading, ask your child to make a prediction about what will happen next in the story, or to summarize what has happened in the story. Math concepts can be reinforced through a family game of cards; basic facts review or adding the cost of items during a shopping trip. Regular conversations regarding local or global events help your child to become aware of the world around them and helps them to analyze and interpret information, ideas, and concepts.

Kindergarten Registrations

If your child will be age 5 on or before December 31, 2024, it is time to register him/her for kindergarten! Please note that our kindergarten classes are filled on an Incatchment, first come, first served basis so please register early to ensure your child has a space here at Unsworth. We already have two

Parking Lot Updates

THANK YOU to all of our drivers...you are making a difference! Some of our parent community are still using the staggered pick-up times, and it is really are working well! With our Primary parents picking up AT the bell, and parents of our Intermediate students being picked up roughly 5 minutes AFTER the bell, it really seems to help keep the flow of traffic moving on Unsworth Road and in our Parking lot. Thank you everyone for your help with this!

- Please remember that the curb lane in front of the flag poles is for quick pick-up or drop-off only and not used for parking or long-term waiting
- When picking up or dropping off your child(ren), please remember to pull up to the curb near the white pick-up/drop-off signs. We have asked students to wait near those signs rather than walking out to the parking lot or near the crosswalk.
- If you are arriving early to pick up your child(ren)— please park in one of the available stalls if there is one vacant.
- Please **do not** park in the Schol Bus lane.

Thank you for doing your part in creating a safe arrival and departure process for our community and a system that works for everyone!



Student Morning Arrival Times and Afternoon Dismissal Reminders

As the morning bell rings at 8:14 a.m., students should not arrive at school prior to 8:00. As the days are shorter and the mornings are dark and cold, we ask that the children arrive closer to the bell, rather than earlier. Supervision of students begins at 8:00 a.m. Students are expected to wait outside until the 8:15 entry bell, unless it is deemed an inside day due to weather. Our afternoon dismissal is at 2:15. Students, who are picked up, should be picked up no later than 2:30. Parents are asked to make alternate arrangements if unable to pick up their child by 2:30 p.m. We are seeing an increase in students needing supervision well past the dismissal and supervision times on a daily basis. Thank you for your support in this matter.
